Celebrate the Birth of Christ during Advent

Beginning this Sunday, December 3, we will all celebrate the season of Advent, focusing on the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ. During the month of December, we will focus on the following themes:

December 3 Hope December 10 Peace December 17 Joy December 24 Love

Then on Christmas Eve, we will join in a 5:00 p.m. service which will culminate in the candlelight singing of "Silent Night," recalling the special night when Jesus was born in Bethlehem.

From Advent through Easter, I will be preaching through the Gospel of John, so I hope you will devote some of your personal Bible reading to that wonderful gospel. John does not give any details about the actual birth of Jesus, but instead considers how God answered the hopes of his people by coming to earth in human form: "The Word became flesh, and made his dwelling among us" (John 1:14).

As we always do, the church will fill the season of Advent with many Christ-focused activities, and I hope you join in as many of these as possible. More details are given later in this newsletter, but allow me to highlight a few of the ways we will celebrate Advent:

- Each Sunday in worship a different family or group of HBC members will light the Advent Wreath.
- We will assist expectant mothers through Christmas tributes which will go to benefit a wonderful ministry "Carried to Full Term."
- We will provide gifts to children of families in need through "Angel Un-Trim-A-Tree." We will also provide food boxes to families in need of extra food.
- We will remember those who have died in recent years during our Service of Remembrance on Sunday December 10 at 3:00 p.m.
- Ken Trammell will lead our choir to present the joyful message of Christ's birth through the Christmas Cantata, "A Thrill of Hope," on Sunday morning, December 17.
- We will present the "Living Nativity," complete with live animals and the singing of our choir on Wednesday, December 20.
- We will conclude Advent with two services on Sunday, December 24 Sunday morning at 11:00 a.m. and the candle-light service at 5:00 p.m.

Let God fill your hearts with the joy of Christ this Christmas season!

Fear Not

re you afraid of anything? I've been afraid of "things that go bump in the night" since watching The Wizard of Oz when I was eight years old. Rarely did I sleep in my own room as a child. Instead, I found comfort in the top bunk of my brother's room. I lived with my parents until I was 17; in college I had a roommate. When I got married, I had a husband at home with me, and later two sons. Years passed and the children left home and in 2018 I found myself alone after my husband died. After Owen's death, my son invited me to stay with him for a while; I ended up staying ten months because I was uncomfortable being alone in my own home at night. Unfortunately, a couple of movies I watched as an adult are stored away in my memory, and they resurface from time to time causing me to be fearful. In 2019, I moved into a new house and neighborhood, and I asked my elderly father to come live with me. I was no longer alone. The darkness of night no longer had an effect on me. All that changed in September 2022 when my dad passed away. A couple of weeks after Dad died I went upstairs to bed and was paralyzed with fear because I knew someone was in my house. At the time, I thought of running next door to my neighbor's house or driving to my son's to seek refuge even though it was after midnight. As you guessed, there wasn't anyone in my house. It was all in my head. I knew running away wasn't the answer. If I didn't get my fear under control what would I do the subsequent nights? In that moment God reminded me of this verse from Philippians 4:8 which says, "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy – meditate on these things". Instead of listening to the enemies lies, I needed to step out in faith and turn my anxiety and fears over to God. I had to trust him to take care of me. I asked the Lord to give me peace, keep me safe and allow me to sleep peacefully throughout the night. God answered my prayer and continues to answer my prayers every night. I believe my reliance on God will help me through uncertain days ahead.

Some individuals might not feel afraid of being alone at night in their home like me, but many have other fears and anxieties. Many people today are fearful and unsure of what is happening in our country and world. We are witnessing an acceleration of evil all around us. Our world is upside down. Where can people turn for guidance and reassurance? God has given us his word to show us his love and how we can have a personal relationship with him because of what Jesus did for us on the cross. We learn how to live and how to treat others by reading and studying the Bible. God's word also reveals what the future holds for this earth. The study of prophesy tells us what to expect before Christ's return and to not be fearful when chaos is happening all around us. In Dr. David Jeremiah's book Where Do We Go from Here? he writes, "But the Lord still has the whole world in His hands, so we must never fear." At any moment, Jesus Christ will descend from heaven for His people. We haven't long to wait. But until then, we need to understand what the age requires – and we need to do what the Lord commands. Don't be fearful, and don't let the times overwhelm you. This world will not end in rubble, but in His return! Our risen and exalted Lord Jesus Christ, our enthroned Savior – **He knows the way forward**.

THE 2023 SEASON OF ADVENT

Sunday, December 3 – Sunday, December 24

Advent is a season where we, as a church, prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ. It is a season of waiting, a reminder of how long God's people waited for the Messiah to be born. Advent begins on Sunday, December 3 and concludes on Christmas Eve, Sunday, December 24 with the arrival of Emmanuel ("God with us"). Advent Devotional Books are available in the overflow room.

As a congregation, Haymarket Baptist Church participates in Advent both in Sunday Worship and multiple service opportunities throughout the season.

Lighting of the Advent Wreath – Beginning with the first Sunday of Advent, December 3, we will light candles in worship each Sunday, corresponding with the Advent themes of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love, culminating with the lighting of the Christ candle on Christmas Eve, Sunday, December 24.

White Christmas, Sunday, December 3 – While we continue to donate items to Jane's pantry throughout December, we will celebrate the HBC tradition of White Christmas on Sunday, December 3.
