Preaching from One of Paul's Last Letters – 1 Timothy

From Mid-June until now, Pastor John and I have been preaching through two of Paul's earliest letters—1 and 2 Thessalonians. John will actually close out our study of 2 Thessalonians by preaching from that letter on August 10. Then on August 17, I will begin preaching a short series of sermons based on one of Paul's last letters—1 Timothy.

Unlike most of Paul's letters, 1 Timothy is NOT written to one of Paul's churches, but instead, is written guidance from the great Apostle to one of his most trusted associate missionaries—Timothy. I think you will find the personal advice Paul gives to Timothy to be very interesting, and frequently applicable to our church today!

When we first meet Timothy in the book of Acts, Paul and Silas are so impressed with this young man that they invite him to join their missionary team, and travel around the Roman Empire telling people about Jesus and launching new churches. Timothy was first taught about Jesus by two Jewish Christians, his mother, Eunice, and his grandmother, Lois. Apparently, his father was a pagan, who prevented Timothy from being circumcised as a child. But the influence of his mother and grandmother were sufficient to lead Timothy to commit his life to following Jesus. His devotion was strong enough to lead Paul and Silas not just to include him in their team, but to entrust him with many important projects for the early church. When Paul could not travel to a church in crisis, he often sent Timothy as his representative. Timothy also was with Paul when he wrote six of his thirteen letters, perhaps even suggesting a few thoughts for inclusion in several of those letters (2 Corinthians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 & 2 Thessalonians, and Philemon). Though Timothy was young, and perhaps a bit meek at first, he eventually became a great leader in the early church.

If any of Timothy's life story resonates with you, perhaps you will enjoy reading the six short chapters of 1 Timothy (averaging less than 20 verses per chapter!) in your daily Bible reading. I hope you will give that a try!

Youth Vacation Bible School

acation Bible School is a cherished summer tradition in churches, including Haymarket Baptist Church. Designed as a dynamic program to teach children about the Bible, VBS blends faith-based learning with engaging activities in a safe and welcoming environment. While most of the spotlight is focused on children, we had the opportunity to cater to our teenagers during the evenings of VBS.

During the week, the program focused on rising 6th graders to 12th grade. Each night had a different focus and also a different adult leading the discussions and spiritual lessons. Monday night, I led a discussion on John 13:1-7, Jesus washing the feet of his disciples. Everyone participated in a hand washing experience to show how we can serve others. Our activity for the night revolved around water games! Tuesday night, Johno led a discussion from Mark 10:13-16 where the little children are brought to Jesus and the importance of everyone in the eyes of Jesus. Later that evening, we had a blast playing laser tag in the church. I believe the adults might've enjoyed it better than the teenagers. Wednesday night, Drew Blincoe, led a powerful devotion on God's love for us using the scripture from 1 John 4:9-12; Ephesians 4:32. After our devotion, the teens with the adults' help, participated in a scavenger hunt using pictures or videos to capture each item on the list.

I'm truly grateful for Christy Wisor, Kristin Olson, Kathy Kennedy, Taylor Crickenberger, Vicki Bayol, Drew Blincoe and Johno Cain who not only helped in the planning and execution of Youth VBS, but made it a point to engage with the teens each night. Adolescence is a pivotal stage for spiritual growth. Youth VBS provided an opportunity where teens can question, learn and grow in faith without judgement. The connections between the teenagers during the week was remarkable to watch. Many of our teens who attended Youth VBS helped volunteer during the morning which continued to foster that community. It has also allowed many of them to step into leadership roles during that week and feel connected to a church that continues to foster and encourage leaders no matter the age. Of course, the fun activities during the week also gave important time to fellowship with each other and build relationships.

Youth Vacation Bible School is more than just a summer program—it's a vital ministry that helps shape the hearts and minds of the next generation of Christian leaders. By providing teens with spiritual guidance, meaningful friendships, and the tools to navigate their faith journey, VBS becomes a transformative experience that can impact them for life.

Whether you're a parent, youth pastor, or church volunteer, investing in Youth VBS is a step toward empowering young believers and strengthening the future of the church.

It is easy to think you are in control of your life. That your good sense will get you through. Just look it up on the internet and run with it.

Not a great choice.

The concept may seem simple, its application requires a profound shift in perspective and a willingness to release our fears, doubts and the need for total control. The journey of letting go and letting God invites us to surrender our burdens and embrace a sense of peace, trust and clarity that can transform how we navigate the intricacies of existence.

Even Jesus prayed to the father for strength when he

saw the hurdle and hard times he was about to face. In Luke 22:41-44, we see Jesus in deep agony, he even prayed to the father to take away his suffering if it was his will. In his time of agony an Angel was sent from heaven to strengthen him.

Talk to God, tell him your worries or your struggles and ask him to help you through it. It wasn't until I prayed that I started to feel at peace with the idea that the house I thought was for me, turned out not to be what God had in mind for us at that time.

There are several Bible verses that I refer to in times of trouble:

"Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid." John 14:27

"Be careful for nothing; but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-7

"Cast thy burden upon the Lord, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved." Psalms 55:22

I recognize actually giving control over to God is more difficult in practice than in theory and when our children were in school managing the days and the weeks and our jobs, and... and... was sometimes more than we were ready for.

These days we are right back at struggling to let God take on the big challenges we face. So far so good.

the Good News of Christ our Savior! We have done several projects in the last year including new boilers, some of our Air Conditioning units, and engineering work for repairing the foundation of our Sanctuary. Much of this work has been even funded by our capital campaign from over 20 years ago, The People of Hope campaign. We did it once and with God's help, we can do it again! Please pray and participate in this effort to maintain the Lord's house. We will be in touch later to plan meeting(s) to discuss when and what we should do; in the meantime, thanks for reading this and praying that we can successfully complete these necessary projects! 
WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY


