Give Our Worship Guests a Warm Welcome!

Each Sunday for the last several months we have been blessed by a large number of guests in worship. I keep a list of recent worship guests (to help me learn their names!) and right now there are 79 names on the list, including 26 children. 79 guests have worshipped with us at least once over the last 2 months!

How each of you welcomes these guests makes it more or less likely that they will return to worship with us again.

First of all, let's all make sure the four "Reserved for Church Visitors" parking spaces are only used by our worship guests. We really ought to have more than four such spaces, but it's crucial that no members park in these spaces—guests only!

Second, our official greeters and ushers do a great job welcoming our worship guests, but if you take an extra 20 seconds each Sunday to spot someone you don't know and welcome them, that will make a big difference. Don't worry that you might accidentally be welcoming an inactive member and offend them by calling them a "visitor." Instead, just say, "Hi! My name is Jason Hudson, what's your name?" Whether the person is a first-time guest or an inactive member, they will still be pleased with your friendly greeting!

Third, I don't expect any of you to memorize 79 names of all the guests who have worshipped with us since May 1. However, I would ask you to make note of people who return to worship a second, third or fourth time and who sit within 15 feet of you in the sanctuary or fellowship hall. Most people quickly develop a general location they prefer in worship and, if they return, will try to sit near the same spot each time. If you see a guest who sat near you two weeks ago, make sure to greet them, offer a handshake, give your name and ask their name. If they have not yet chosen a seat, invite them to sit next to you. Then, when you sit down, write their name down to help your brain remember their name. Call them by name the next Sunday you see them and you may be on the way to making a new friend. Like the classic TV show "Cheers," people love to go to a place, "where everybody knows your name"!

The early church grew by telling people about a Savior who gave his life on the cross for them. This is our gospel message. But people will NOT listen to a church who proclaims that Jesus loves them if the members of that church do not also demonstrate that love through giving warm welcomes to folks. The early church got people to return to worship by giving warm welcomes to poor, older women, children, people of all races, wealthy, singles, slaves, Gentiles, and Jews. Help Jesus by giving a warm welcome to at least one new person this Sunday!

ummer Greetings Everyone from your Stewardship Committee! We hope everyone will have a blessed summer and will be able to enjoy some time with family and/or friends! We also appreciate everyone's contributions to HBC so far this year! Specifically our contributions through May 31, 2025 are almost \$290,000 (includes designated offerings and pre-school funds) which exceeds our YTD budget forecast of approximately \$249,000. To keep things in perspective, however, we have also spent over \$40,000 in capital expenses (HVAC systems and engineering studies primarily). These capital expenses are not included in our budget so the net status is we have spent about \$3,000 more than we have received. There are other large capital expenditures coming soon for various things including foundation repairs of approximately \$225,000. While we are very appreciative of the tithes and offerings received, we want everyone to keep in mind that our operating costs and capital expenditures are on-going. Even though the summer months are historically our lowest receipts of the year, our expenses continue. Please continue to keep our church in your prayers and seek the Lord's will in how you can help meet our needs to spread the Good News here and throughout the world!

As we have mentioned previously, for those of us who have reached the age where Required Minimum Distributions (RMD's) must be made from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) your taxable income can be minimized by having money sent directly from the IRA to Haymarket Baptist Church. This can reduce your taxes due while contributing to the Lord's work. Like many other facets of tax law, there are certain requirements for this. Please see your tax or financial advisor for more details. On a different subject, if anyone is led to make a bequest (the act of giving or leaving something by will) to HBC, your generosity would be much appreciated and allows one to create a legacy for the future of HBC and our Lord's kingdom.


