Tomorrow (August 28), Linda and I will take a short trip to Winston-Salem, North Carolina, returning on Saturday so that I can preach on Sunday morning. By the time you read this column, our trip should be complete.

Linda and I originally thought about planning this trip so we could watch my alma mater, Wake Forest, play its opening game of the football season. The Deacons play on Friday, August 29, so that should leave plenty of time for us to drive back to Northern Virginia on Saturday.

But since our original plans were discussed, a far more important matter has come to our attention. My best friend from high school, Dan Kibler, who also lives in Winston-Salem, called to tell me that his heart is failing and his cardiologist told him that he must have a heart transplant. The doctor asked him to move into the cardiac care wing of Baptist Hospital in Winston-Salem. While Linda and I will still go to the football game Friday night, our complete focus will be visiting with Dan in the hospital and spending time with his wife Barb. We may see a few of his four children as well, or his elderly parents.

Each day since I heard from Dan, Linda and I have been praying for him to receive a new heart. We will continue to pray for him daily until the surgery is complete. I would invite you to pray for Dan as well. Revelation 5:8 tells us that the 24 elders in heaven "were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of God's people." Your prayers are important to God!

I have known Dan Kibler since he accidently took my light blue jacket after choir practice about 60 years ago. We became best friends in high school. I was best man in his wedding and Dan was best man in Linda's and my wedding. I love Dan Kibler. I ask you to pray for God to grant him a new heart!

DEACON'S BENCH

think about weddings a lot these days. As a bride-to-be, my mind gravitates towards this subject on a regular basis, so I decided to research references to weddings in the Bible.

In John 2:1-11, Jesus chose a wedding in Cana to perform his first miracle by turning 120 gallons of water into wine. In Matthew 22:1-14, we find the parable of the wedding banquet where Jesus spoke about God and how he invites all people to accept his son as their Lord and Savior and enjoy the Kingdom of Heaven. The Jews were invited first, but most rejected it. The invitation was then given to the Gentiles. This parable emphasizes the importance of accepting God's invitation and the urgency in responding with genuine faith. The Parable of the Ten Virgins is found in Matthew 25:1-13 and tells about ten virgins who are bridesmaids waiting for the bridegroom to arrive for a wedding. Five are wise and are prepared with enough oil for their lamps, but the other five virgins are foolish; they only had enough oil for a short period of time, so they leave to buy more oil. While they are away, the bridegroom finally arrives and the wise virgins enter the wedding feast with him. The door is shut, and when the foolish virgins return, they are denied entrance.

In the Bible, the Church – which is made up of individual believers – is referred to as "The Bride" and Jesus is pictured as "The Bridegroom".

In the documentary, Before the Wrath, research


shows a correlation between first century Galilean wedding customs and the rapture of the Church. In this custom the bride and bridegroom would be betrothed to one another for an extended period of time. This time was spent in preparation – the groom returning to his father's house to build an addition to the family home, to prepare for his bride. The bride would prepare herself for the groom's return. Surprisingly, neither the groom or bride knew the day or hour the wedding would take place. The bridegroom's father would decide when the wedding should occur. Then, he would send his son to get his bride. The two would return to the father's house where the wedding would take place.

Toward the end of Jesus' ministry his disciples asked him what would be the sign of his coming. In Matthew 24:36 it reads, "No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father".

Jesus said, "And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you may be where I am". In Revelation 19:7 we read, "Let us rejoice and be glad and give him glory! For the wedding of the Lamb has come, and his bride has made herself ready".

I am anticipating my wedding day. As the bride of Christ, are we, the Church, anticipating our heavenly wedding day with The Lamb of God?

ALMA HUNT Offering for Virginia Missions

he annual offering for Virginia missions was named for Alma Hunt (1909-2008), a native Virginian who was known worldwide for her missions service and her unswerving dedication to the cause of Christ. Churches and individuals may contribute at any time.

The offering provides funding for all <u>HerMission</u> (WMUV) missions and ministries and makes possible other special ministries, outreach projects, and initiatives not funded through regular streams of giving (but uniquely connected to Virginia Baptists).

Since 1976, this offering has been a joint venture between HerMission and the <u>Baptist General</u> Association of Virginia (BGAV).

The annual goal and allocation of funds are determined by the Executive Director/Treasurer of HerMission and the Executive Director of the BGAV and approved by their respective boards.

When you give to the Alma Hunt Offering for Virginia Missions, you are equipping those who seek to share with others how God has set them free to live and serve.

The following are some examples of a ministry that was impacted by this offering: community missions; "SHINE" – living faith for teen girls inspiring them with missionaries' stories; disaster response: rebuilding with hope; and, sisters who care: mission in action.


