# Give Your Church a Christmas Present This Year!

This year I am asking each member of the church to give your church a Christmas present during the season of Advent. Additionally, I am being so bold as to suggest four possible gifts, though only asking each of you to give one of the four gifts. Each gift requires a bit of a sacrifice on your part—but the most meaningful gifts often do require a sacrifice by the giver.

Here are the four gifts I hope you will consider giving this year:

Gift #1—On Sunday, December 14, the Sunday of our Choir Christmas Cantata, park your car on the grassy portion of our parking lot. This will free up a paved parking space for one of the many dozens of guests who will worship with us that Sunday. They will appreciate your generosity!

Gift #2—On Sunday, December 14, sit in the Fellowship Hall and watch the Choir Christmas Cantata on the big 86" screen TV. This will free up a seat in the sanctuary for our guests to enjoy the choir's presentation of the birth of Jesus.

Gift #3—For the 5:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service, park your car on the grassy area at the back of our parking lot. Last year, 135 people attended our Christmas Eve service, and they came in nearly 100 cars, which is more cars than can fit in our paved spaces. If 20 or 25 members park their cars in the grassy area, you will free up paved spaces so our guests can have those spaces.

Gift #4—Sit in the Fellowship Hall to watch the Christmas Eve service on the 86" TV. I know this is not as enjoyable as sitting in the sanctuary on Christmas Eve, but it is a sacrifice that you can make to allow one of our guests to have your seat in the sanctuary. I believe Jesus Christ will be pleased with any of these four gifts, which each require you to make a sacrifice to bless your neighbor.

# HBCPK PARTNERS WITH HBC TO AID JAMAICA HURRICANE RELIEF

ollowing the tremendous devastation to Jamaica from Hurricane Melissa, HBCPK (our preschool) was quick to want to help. The schools and communities they have worked with and supported over the past 12 years were some of the most seriously damaged! The preschool works with an organization called Jamaica Link Ministries in Montego Bay, with the organization president, Pastor Dave Falconer. This Christian organization works with groups in the US to link with organizations in Jamaica that need help. College kids, youth groups, teachers, church groups - all kinds of groups organize a trip to Jamaica and get set up with something that interests them - an orphanage, a disabled children's home, impoverished preschools, Baptist Bible College, old folks home, school for the deaf, etc.

One of the preschools that our preschool (HBCPK) supports is in the mountains about 1.5 hours from Montego Bay—it is very remote. The preschool there is destroyed. HBCPK put a lot of work into that school, so it is very sad to us...the elementary school next door, also was very damaged...but the community surrounding the schools were absolutely destroyed. They have no power, no water, no shelter, no food, no work...crops destroyed, farm animals didn't make it and it is so remote—no one has come to help as of yet. The other school, which is in a very impoverished area outside of Montego Bay called Flanker also sustained much damage, lost its water tank and the playground was severely damaged.

Mrs. Frasz learned of a container being packed for Montego Bay in Raleigh, NC and found out that others from Jamaica Link Ministries were working to fill it. After contacting the right people, HBCPK was informed that there was room in the container to help this area in the mountains called Cornwall Mountain. So, an effort began to collect food, medicine, tarps, hygiene items, first aid materials and clothing. The preschool parents at HBCPK donated in big ways financially, from an Amazon wish list, a signup genius and giving us gently used clothing. Volunteer staff and parents helped pack up 28 large heavy duty moving boxes and Mr. and Mrs. Frasz, along with a preschool dad took 2 vehicles to Angier, NC (near Raleigh) to begin their journey to desperately needy people. The container, projected to arrive on Monday, November 24th, will be offloaded at Fairhaven (JLM Pastor Dave's ministry place and now a relief center) and a team including Americans will oversee the unloading distribution. The items for the schools are packed and labeled and a small truck is at the ready to take the things up the mountain! Once at the school, JLM will assess the damage to see what else we can do to support this remote community – an elementary school with bad roof damage and a preschool with the entire roof gone.

Mr. and Mrs. Frasz plan to travel to Jamaica in January, in conjunction with HBC's commitment to assist. The plan will be to purchase needed fresh water tanks for both schools and pay to have them filled. We will also grocery shop for needed food and health items and plan to give some financial 'love' to the school teachers who have been without pay this entire time. If we have enough money to do some minor repairs, we will do this as well or hire local craftsmen for things like doors, floors and windows. We will be assessing the damage to the interior of the school in Flanker to see what needs to be replaced or fixed due to damage. The school on Cornwall Mountain, as well as the surrounding community, has been told they will likely not get power back for 1 year. The local pastor and his wife (Dave and Nadine Falconer) have also sustained much damage to Fairhaven (the place that organizations and teams come to serve and stay) - so if we can help this amazing couple get their ministry back up and running, it would be a blessing to the future teams that come down to help.

The preschool working together with the church is such a significant blessing and we are so grateful to come together in the midst of such a disaster. If we think about not having power, water, food or shelter...a job, crops or lost livestock – the physical and emotional toll would be overwhelming. In the middle of it all – Pastor Dave's little church had 10 people show up that Sunday after the hurricane and met in a little alcove of the damaged church and sang 'It is well...with my soul...it is well, it is well...with my soul'. To sing praise to the Lord, literally in the storm – what a powerful and resilient message to us all!

Thank you for all you might consider doing to help all these children, their schools, the needs of *Jamaica Link Ministries* as they serve other impacted churches and homes, and a pastor, too!

We all look forward to the Live Nativity each year – so that is on many school family calendars, too!
